FROM THE BIODIVERSITY AND CLIMATE CRISIS WORKING PARTY OF THE PARISH COUNCIL:

Did you know there are 18 species of bats in the UK?

Common Pipistrelles are widespread and will likely be found on bat walks. Daubenton's bats are commonly found in Leicestershire and usually fly over rivers and near wooded areas so the river Soar would be an ideal place to spot these bats. If you want to spot some bats or help out with bat surveys, then the best way is to use a bat detector, a small device that converts the ultrasonic calls of bats into audible noises, usually clicking noises. Bats call at different frequencies which are then translated into different sounds over the bat detector which allows you to identify different species.

How can we help bats? You can buy a prebuilt bat box or bat box kit or build one https://www.rspb.org.uk/get-involved/activities/nature-on-your-doorstep/garden-activities/build-a-bat-box/

One of the biggest dangers to bats is artificial light, because it changes how they perceive times of the day. For example, artificial light shining on bat roosts can delay emergence from roosts as the light tricks the bats into believing it is still day when they hunt. This can affect feeding patterns by causing bats to miss the peak time of insect abundance which affects both the survival of individuals and the growth rates of the young. Having artificial light shining on a roost entrance can cause bats to abandon the roost or become entombed within a roost as they can be less inclined to leave the roost in light-heavy conditions. There are ways to prevent or reduce the harm caused to bats by artificial lighting, such as:

- Make sure that there are no bat roosts in the vicinity before setting up lights.
- Angling lights to avoid roost entrances.
- Use motion sensor lights to limit the number of time roosts, feeding areas and flight paths are lit up.
- Use bat-friendly lighting, often this comes in the form of coloured red lights
- Avoid placing lights along with linear features (such as hedgerows) as this is how bats navigate and around water sources, as these are prime feeding spots for bats.
